

Ideally the children will be able to:


- Complete the work independently
- If unable, they can ask their class teacher/someone from home for extra support

This will run as a monthly optional home learning task that your child can pick, complete and then tell the class about.



In 2023, we spent £8,000 purchasing exciting, appropriate and varied reading books. There's something for everyone!



Regular reading rehearsal at home is crucial for building reading fluency which is transferrable to every subject.

- A colour banded reading book (even for free readers) will be sent home. If your child finishes the book quickly you can support their learning by rereading it a few times.
- Rereading supports fluency. We all want to help children develop into fluent readers who aren't stumbling over every single word. Rereading is one of the BEST ways to build that fluency because they are building on their previous knowledge of the story and vocabulary and instead of having to focus so much on each word, they can read with much more fluency on repeat readings.

What?

- This year we are making a change to the 'Top of the Hill' badge system.

TT ROCKSTARS

In your child's home learning book, you will see login details to TT Rockstars, this is an online times table program that we purchase to help the children practise their times tables in a fun and engaging way.

When they first use TT Rockstars they will see lots of different times tables as the algorithms learn which ones each child knows and needs to practise. If you have any concerns about this, please speak to your child's class teacher as they can set a limit on the tables they see, on some of the games the children play.











Year 3

Year 3 will take part in a workshop run by the Stevenage Borough Council based around regeneration. The content will link in with outdoor learning and geography fieldwork. The children will learn what regeneration is and how the Stevenage Borough Council are regenerating the town to benefit them. They will look at different maps and a small-town model to find out about the different projects happening locally. As they move through the school, they will have different trips/workshops based on this.
