They will have learnt to position the body to strike a ball and thrown a ball using both underarm and overarm throws.</li> <li>In lower KS2, children will have demonstrated successful hitting and striking skills and will have practised striking the ball for distance. They will have developed different ways of throwing and catching with greater control and accuracy. They will have begun to think about how to use space and develop fielding skills as an individual to prevent a player from scoring. They will have applied these skills in small competitive games.</li> </ul>
