Application/ Outcomes		 At KS1, children have previously practised basic throwing, catching and passing skills and applied these to some small team games. In lower KS2, children have practised different passing skills and various ways of moving with the ball, using more accuracy and control than at KS1. They have started to think about attacking and defending principles in game situations as well as using space in game play. They have begun to think about applying tactics in game play and have a basic understanding of the rules of tag rugby.
		To apply all of the above skills in small sided games. There should be a greater focus on developing the tactics used in game play and getting children to understand why certain tactics are better and when to use them most effectively.
