- Historical Knowledge

 - Use historical evidence to understand the events that took place from different perspectives
- Historical Concepts
 - Provide a coherent argument as to which interpretation of a person, event or society is the most valid, using historical evidence.

What we already know

- Children will have studied the Romans in year
 3 and Ancient Greek & Ancient Egypt in year 4
- Year 5 focus is on Invaders/settlers
- Year 6 pupils will also have some background knowledge about other aspects of the War from The War English unit which runs simultaneously

Application/ Outcomes

- Identifying what a primary/secondary source of evidence is.
- Discuss and analyse primary and secondary sources of evidence in the context of WW2
- Ensure children understand the term 'chronology'. Create a timeline of key events
- Learn/write about the key events that led to the War and discuss whether it could have been avoided. Evacuation- write letters from the perspective of children. Was evacuation a good thing?
- Rationing- food shortages- what impact did this have on households? Written worksheet.
- Propaganda- Discuss and evaluate a range of WW2 propaganda posters. Discuss and explain how the interpretation of propaganda (from British/German perspectives) was the most valid Design own 'Dig For Victory' poster.

Concepts

- What was going on during the war in other parts of the world?
- Know that chronology is vital in understanding how and why key events happened in a certain order.
- Understand how propaganda was an important tool to influence public opinion in Britain and Germany during the War and how it is used today in different ways
- Understand how historical evidence from different sources influences how we interpret people, events or societies
- Understand how an event like war has a significant impact on different people: soldiers, women, families, the enemy
- Understand how events of the past have shaped the country we live in today
