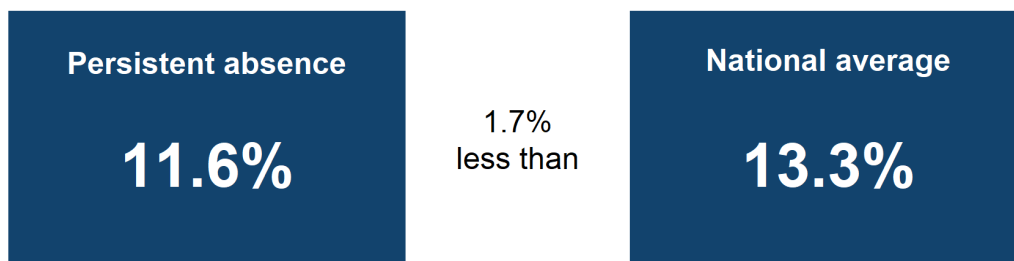

### Persistent Absence



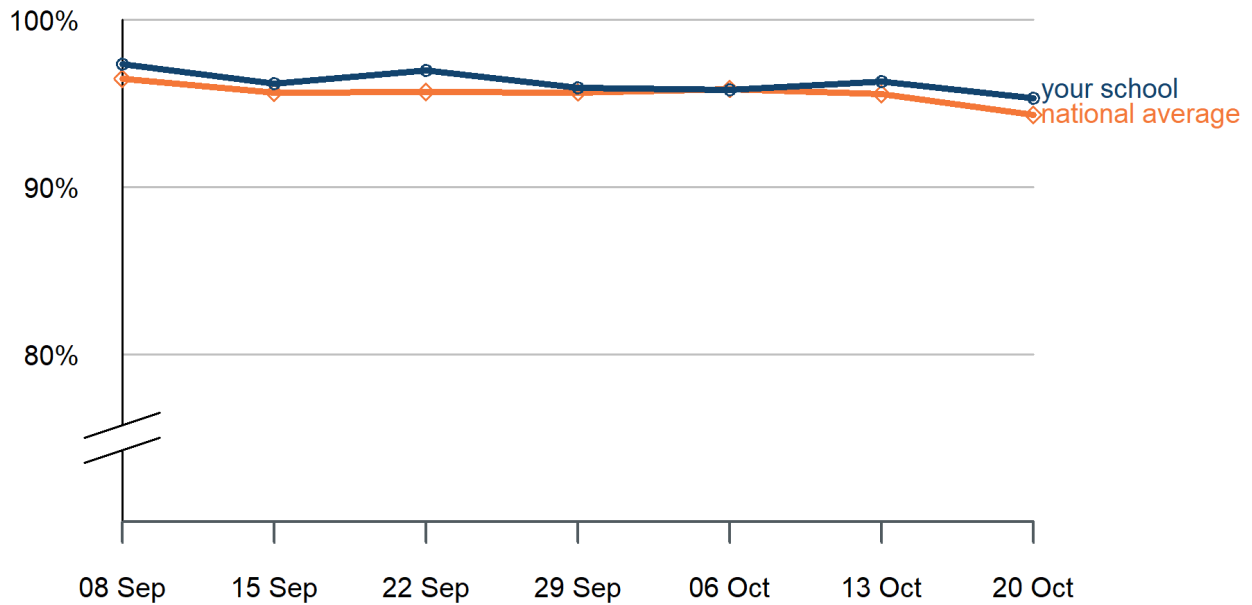

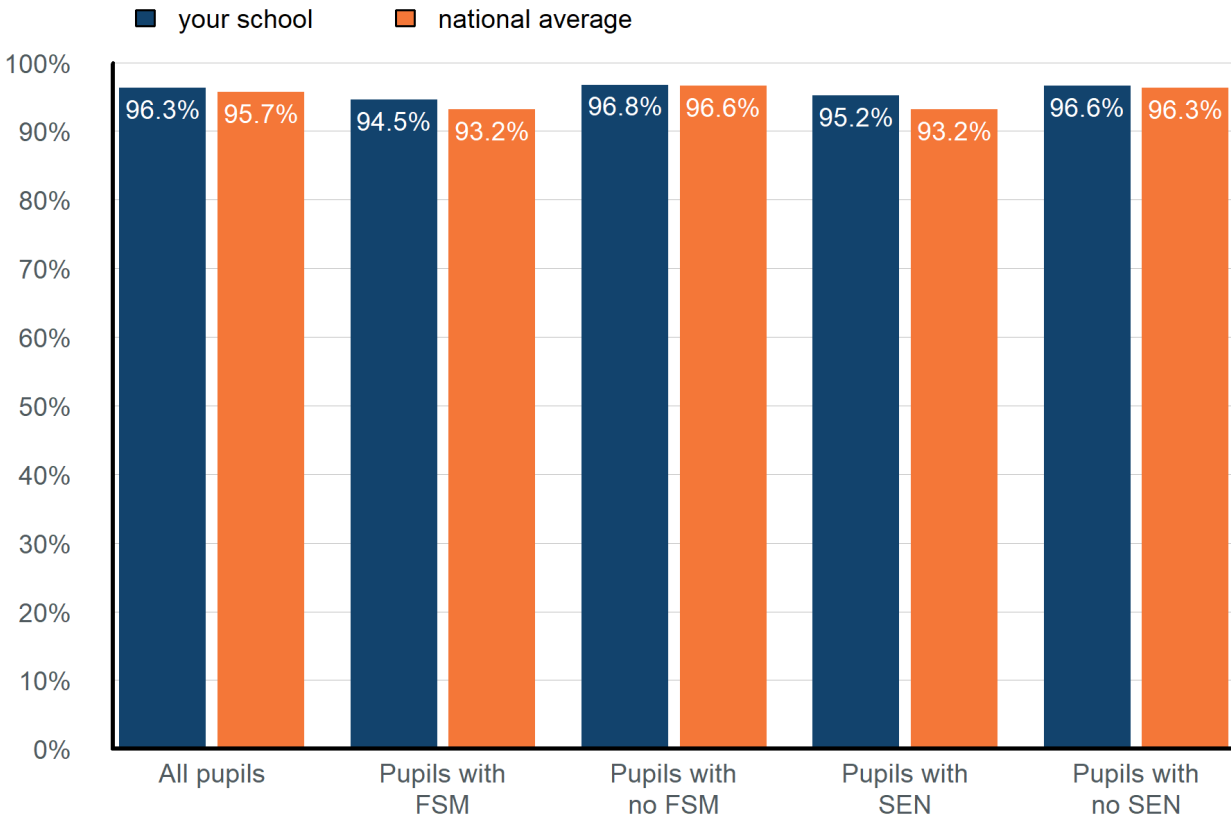

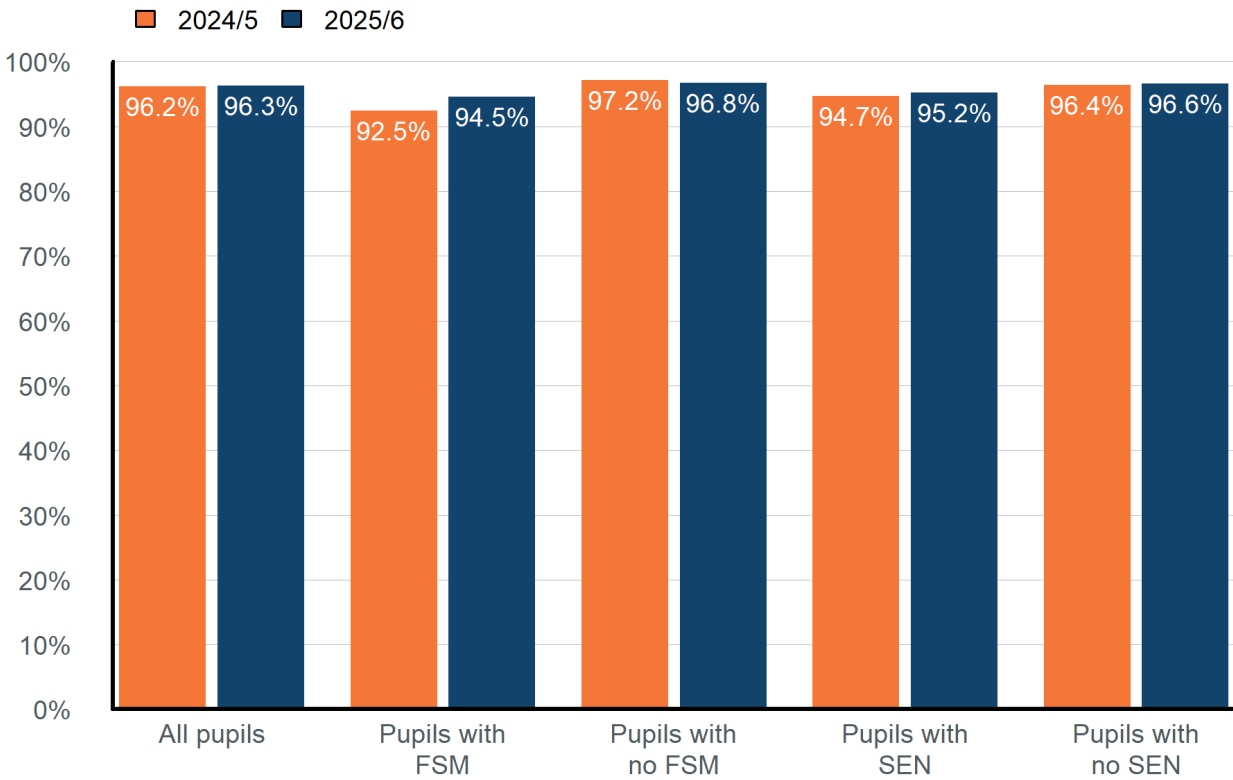
